For Weekend of August 17 - 19

- Read *A Public Faith: How Followers of Christ Should Serve the Common Good*
- Write a 4-6 page paper developing a biblical/theological understanding of missions incorporating the ministry of ascent, the ministry of prophecy and the importance of community as integral parts of the understanding. **This paper should be mailed or emailed to Mike no later than August 10, 2018.**
- Read *Christian Missions: How Christianity Became a World Religion*
- From the text select three ideas/events/aspects of missions that changed the church's concept or practice of missions and how these relate to current mission work. Be prepared to present one of your three in class. The paper should be 4-5 pages in length. **Bring this paper to class with you.**
- Read *Ferguson and Faith: Sparking Leadership and Awakening Community*

For Weekend of October 19 - 21 (Bring papers to class with you)

- Read *Good News to the Poor: John Wesley's Evangelical Economics*
- Read *John Wesley's Sermons* specifically
 - Upon our Lord's Sermon on the Mount, VIII (1748)
 - The Use of Money (1760)

- The Good Steward (1768)
- The Dangers of Riches (1781)
- The New Creation (1787)
- Write a 4-5 page paper describing Wesley's theology and application of stewardship (recognize stewardship is more than money but never less than money) and how this relates to the work of missions within the church
- Utilizing Census data, Mission Insite or other appropriate source, bring a demographic report on your community. If using Mission Insite (WV Conference can obtain this easily: bring information on the top three Mosaics as well)
- Bring with you a sheet describing faith based and secular programs that provide for those in need along with detailed information including address, times available, of needs addressed, frequency of use, etc.
- Visit one of the faith based programs (not affiliated with your congregation) and one of the secular programs that offer similar services. Write a 1 – 2 page paper comparing/contrasting the services.
