Course Description:

This course focuses on preaching the Gospel from the Old and New Testaments. Students will be able to:

1. Articulate a theology of proclamation.
2. Exegete a variety of biblical passages for preaching.
3. Evaluate sermons for biblical integrity, theological soundness, internal logic, and delivery, and appropriate insights gained from the evaluation of their own sermons.
4. Develop plans for ordering and delivering sermons in their congregational and communal context.

Due by March 10, 2023

1. Read *Craddock on the Craft of Preaching* by Fred Craddock.
Write a paragraph with 3-5 sentences that captures the main idea on each chapter in the book. Then attach an essay (1-2 pages) exploring the following:
 - 1) What you learned
 - 2) How you were challenged
 - 3) Where do you agree and disagree with Craddock,
 - 4) What ideas from Craddock's work will you incorporate into your preaching life?
2. Please submit a written description of how you prepare to preach. Tell me what you study, how you study, and how you spend your week preparing for Sunday. What's your favorite preaching resource? Additionally, tell me how you do long term planning, how you keep sermon ideas/stories, and what, if any, group you may meet with to help you brainstorm/write sermons.

Reading List to be completed before March 17th:

Craddock on the Craft of Preaching – Read the whole book

The Preaching Life – Read the whole book

The New Interpreter's Handbook of Preaching – Read the following sections:

- 1. **Bible:** Read everything **except** *Allegory/Allegoresis, Apocalypticism, Archaeology, Literal Sense, Philosophical Hermeneutics, Suspicion, Typology.*
- 2. **Bible Genres:** Read the introduction only
- 4. **Literary Criticism:** Read the introduction only
- 5. **Poetics:** Read the introduction and *Focus and Function Statements, Moves, Narrative Preaching, Theme Sentence*
- 6. **Preacher:** Read *Sermon Research* only
- 7. **Social Location:** Read the introduction only.
- 8. **Experience:** Read the introduction and *African American Preaching Perspectives, Celebration, Lectionary, and the Christian Year.*
- 10. **Sermon:** Read the introduction and *Deductive, Four Pages of a Sermon, Inductive, Manuscript, New Homiletic, Point Form, Popular Psychology, and Preaching*
- 11. **Theology:** Read the introduction only.

Due on March 19, 2023

1. A 10-12 minute sermon that you have written and preached prior to coming to class. You will preach this sermon in front of the class during our first weekend.

Due by March 31, 2023

1. Prepare an exegesis on one of the lectionary texts for April or May 2023. Please use the exegesis format covered in class on March 17-19th.
2. Prepare a wedding or funeral sermon. This can be a sermon you have preached at a wedding or funeral. Attach a one page statement about your exegetical process for a wedding or funeral sermon.
3. Participate in our class Facebook page (This assignment will be further explained the first weekend of class).

- 7. Social Location: Read *Collaboration, Preaching to Children, Preaching to Youth, Pulpit – Use of, and Worship Style*
- 8. Experience: Read *Lectio Continua, Lectio Divina, and Revivals*
- 9. Rhetoric: Read *Memory*
- 10. Sermon: Read *Funeral and Wedding*

Due by April 16, 2023

1. Write a sermon on the text you exegeted. You will preach this sermon in front of the class and be graded for content, form, and delivery.

Due by April 28, 2023

1. A revised manuscript of the sermon you preached in class on April 23rd. Your revisions should be based on the feedback you received from your classmates and instructor when you preached the sermon in class. Provide a 1-2 page reflection on the concepts from class and the readings that you are employing to revise the sermon.
2. Write (2) 2 page papers on any two sermons in Barbara Brown Taylor's book. Offer a reflection on the sermons and make sure to incorporate concepts from the readings and lectures.

Extra Credit

1. Read a book from the supplemental textbook list and do a one page report.
2. Read 3 John Wesley sermons and write a half page critique of each sermon.

3. Begin your story file and provide me with documentation of the first 75 stories (can be in any format).
4. Attend a sermon preparation group at least three times before May 7, 2022. Write a 2 page reflection on how this group has shaped your preaching life. Virtual attendance for this assignment is more than acceptable. Please follow the COVID-19 safety protocols!
